Papers, as last year, will be judged on their presentation, content and timing, with emphasis on the first of these. Invited papers will not be included in the awards. This year the role of head judge has been filled by Wayne W. Brideaux of Calgary. Those planning to attend the Anaheim Meeting, October 16th-20th, 1973, and who might be interested in judging, are invited to write to the head judge. Approximately 12 judges will be needed, including the head judge; three of these will be named alternates.

The recipient of the award is urged to publish his or her paper in the AASP Annual Proceedings Volume.

A.A.S.P. Contributions Series No. 2, entitled "A Glossary of the Terminology Applied to Dinoflagellate Amphiesmae and Cysts and Acritarchs" by G. L. Williams, W. A. S. Sarjeant and E. J.
